Fanny Shaw Graham, 102 of Walnut Ridge; passed away July 13, 2020 in the Baptist Health Medical Center in Little Rock.

Born March 25, 1918 in Saffell; daughter of the late, John and Mary Morgan Shaw. She was united in marriage to Ira Spencer Graham on March 5, 1934. The young couple moved to Missouri and cleared land by hand as a team. Fanny chopped wood, sawed timbers, picked cotton, and worked on her family's Dairy farm. She was also a loving mother and dedicated housewife. After her children were grown, she worked in the Cafeteria at the Lawrence Memorial Hospital.
