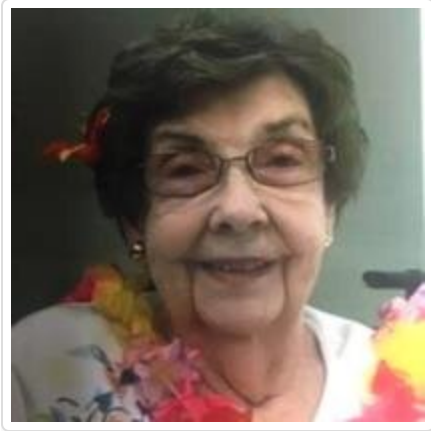




Joyce Kathryn Weir
