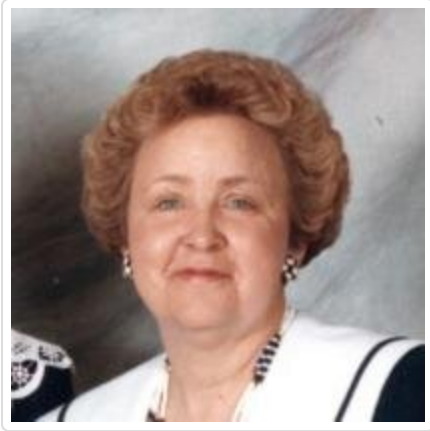




Patsy Kay Gwaltney

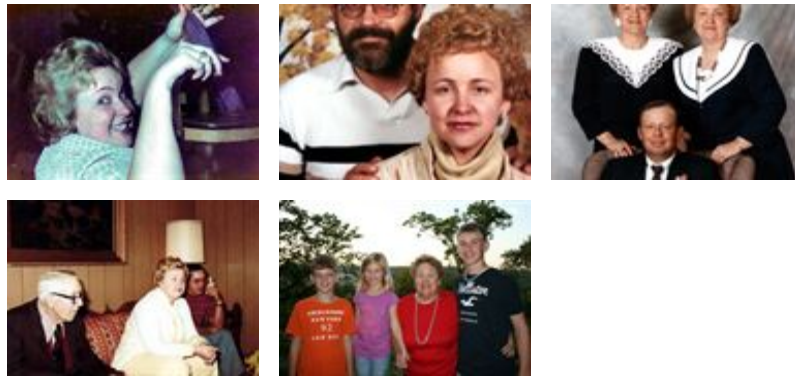
